DETAILED Itinerary.



Day 1 :- Depart from Delhi

- We depart from Delhi around 9:00 - 10.00 PM in an AC Volvo. (Know the true value of time; snatch, seize, and enjoy every moment of it.)
- Pit stop for dinner at any decent roadside restaurant.



Day 2 :- Shimla To Chitkul/Sangla

- **Drive through Kufri and Narkanda along the Indo-Tibetan Highway on your way to Chitkul.**
- **Enter the Kinnaur Valley by crossing the Kinnaur Gate, a rock tunnel famously known as the Gateway to Kinnaur. This tunnel is located around 170 km from Shimla on the Shimla-Kaza road, also called the Hindustan-Tibet Road.**
- **Explore the last Indian village before the China border and immerse yourself in the stunning white wonderland.**
- **Arrive in Chitkul by evening.**
- **Dinner and an overnight stay in Chitkul/Rakchham.**



Day 3 :- Chitkul - Khab - Tabo

- **Start your day by waking up early to embrace the freshness of the morning and relish a hearty breakfast before setting off on your journey towards Tabo.**
- **On your way, you'll witness the confluence of the Spiti and Satluj Rivers at the Khab Bridge.**
- **Once you cross Sumdo and enter the picturesque Spiti Valley, take a pause to explore the Gue Monastery in Gue village.**
- **Spend some time here to unwind before resuming your journey to Tabo.**
- **In Tabo, treat yourself to a scrumptious dinner and spend the night at a comfortable hotel.**



Day 4 :- Tabo to Kaza

- **Wake up early morning and after having breakfast, head for Kaza.**
- **On the way to Kaza we will visit Dhankar monastery. This is a charming village nestled among ancient rocky ridges that have stood the test of time for over a thousand years.**
- **Take some time to discover the beauty of the Dhankar Monastery before continuing to Kaza Reach Kaza in the evening.**
- **Hotel check in. Dinner and sleep overnight.**



Day 5 :- Hikkim - Komic - Langza

- **Wake up early morning and have breakfast.**
- **Later head out for the sightseeing of Spiti Valley.**
- **Visit Key Monastery – th world famous center for Buddhist learning located at the top of mountains.**

- **Have Dinner and overnight stay in Kaza.**



Day 6 :- Kaza to Chandratal

- **On the way , take a pit stop for snacks at Losar, the last village of Spiti Valley**
- **Reach Chandra Taal by evening and check in camps.**
- **Have dinner, Overnight stay under the gaze of Billion stars and the Milky way Galaxy.**

Note : Stay in Chandra Taal will be on Quad / Triple Sharing Basis Only.

PAYMENT Policy

- 15 to 20 days or more from the date of departure: 50% of the tour cost (Booking Amount) to be paid by Customer.
- 10 to 15 days from the date of departure: 100% of the tour cost to be paid by Customer.
- Any flight bookings, Train bookings shall be paid 100% in advance.
- Payments by credit card incur an extra handling fee (as charged by the payment gateways) 2.5% for Indian credit cards.
- 4.5% for international credit cards over the invoiced amount.

CANCELLATION Policy

- Booking amount is Non Refundable.
- No phone/WhatsApp cancellations; reply to the email with payment receipt.
- Free cancellation up to 45 days before departure (booking amount non-refundable).
- 44-30 days: 10% + booking amount charged as cancellation fee.
- 29-20 days: 25% + booking amount charged.
- 19-15 days: 50% + booking amount charged.
- 15-10 days: 75% of total cost charged.
- 10 days or less: 100% charged.
- No show: No refund.
- Refunds incur 2.5% Payment Gateway charge & 5% GST, except UPI transactions.
- Credit note only available if cancelled 15 days before (organization's discretion).
- No refunds for cancellations due to natural calamities/unforeseen circumstances, but alternatives may be provided.
